What type of Employer-Led Training is right for your organization?

Plus - find out what <u>funding is available</u> to help support your training needs

Incumbent Worker Training is intended for workers with an established work history with the current employer, and who have the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed by their current employer but because of changes in the necessary skills to remain in their position, to advance in the company, or to avoid a layoff, the employees now need additional training

On-the-Job Training (OJT) is a federal program funded by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), and lets you hire and train skilled workers and get reimbursed for your efforts.

Registered apprenticeship programs help recruit and develop a highly skilled workforce, benefiting both employer and apprentice. Employers see reduced turnover, lower training costs and improved productivity while apprentices have the opportunity to earn a paycheck while receiving hands-on training and instruction that result in successful, well-paid and highly respected careers. An apprenticeship program includes a paid-work component and an education or instructional component tailored to industry needs. Programs can be integrated into an organizations current training curriculum and human resource development strategy
