





### Real Time Unemployment Data for Lancaster County - May Update




The Lancaster County Workforce Development Board tracks daily, weekly and monthly unemployment claims. After a peak of 19,234 initial claims reported in Lancaster week ending April 4, we have continued to trend downwards for initial claims. Last year at this time, Lancaster indicated 275 initial claims week ending May 30, 2019 vs. 1,127 claims this past week in 2020.

Continued Unemployment Claims are the bi-weekly claims that eligible participants submit to continue their initial claim. This is a leading indicator, along with reduced initial claims, that people are returning to work.
