#### Manufacturing establishments need 3,679 employees to meet local need in 2021

The Lancaster County Workforce Development Board tracks occupation and education trends to assist jobseekers, businesses and training providers prepare to meet the demands of the future

Manufacturing continues to be a top industry in Lancaster County, making up 14.3% of total employment (2020Q1). Average wages are competitive at \$57,382 annually. The industry has grown .2% in the last 10 years. A high rate of exits and transfers mainly due to retirements show a labor force demand of over 3,679 individuals in the next year.
