

Olympians and their Day Jobs #Tokyo2020

In honor of the summer <u>Olympics</u> in Tokyo, Japan, a joyous occasion happening a year later than it was supposed to due to a global pandemic, we wanted to celebrate the vision of the Olympic Games, and also recognize some of the awesome careers that these Olympians have as their "day jobs". Yes, you heard that right...many Olympians train in their sport along with working full-time jobs such as engineers, doctors, lawyers, teachers, entrepreneurs, and more. Check





out this quick read from **Buzz Feed** that highlights global Olympic athlete's fulfilling careers. Attributes of athletes, professional or amateurs, are often the same attributes found in good employees including self control, persistence, attention to detail, and teamwork of course! No wonder these athletes are winners!

Taking a look at the occupation of "Athletes and Sports Competitors"

According to a 2019 article in **Next Gen Personal Finance**, "We often hear from teachers that students are convinced that professional sports are the road to riches but besides the challenge of making it to this pinnacle (only 0.03% of high school seniors playing basketball ultimately get drafted after playing college ball), almost 99% of millionaires have



generated their wealth outside of professional sports. Then again, athletes who suddenly come into millions from their first contract often struggle to live within their means while we have also uncovered examples of celebs who are famous but frugal too. So, the Question of the Day is: **What percent of U.S. millionaires are professional athletes? Answer:** About 1% of U.S. millionaires (those earning \$1 million/year) are professional athletes.

O*Net Online classifies Athletes and Sports Competitors under the Standard Occupation Code (SOC) 27-2021.00. This occupation lists some sample job titles of Baseball Pitcher, Baseball Player, Basketball Player, Golf Professional, Hockey Player, Major League Baseball Player, Minor League Baseball Player, Professional Athlete, Professional Golf Tournament Player, and Race Car Driver. The median wages in PA are \$50,850, but vary by region, especially those with professional sports teams like Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, whose median wages top \$200,000/yr. In 2019 in the Commonwealth, there were 13,600 people employed as athletes and this occupation is expected to grow faster than average. Projections estimate 2,100 job
