

Together For Mental Health



Mental Health and Substance Abuse Social Workers Employment Outlook

<u>Mental Health and Substance Abuse Social Workers</u> assess and treat individuals with mental, emotional, or substance abuse problems, including abuse of alcohol, tobacco, and/or other drugs. Activities may include individual and group therapy, crisis intervention, case management, client advocacy, prevention, and education. Lancaster County is in demand of 299 Social Workers in the next 10 years. Social Workers earn an average wage of \$42,000 annually. Post-Secondary training is required. There are many pathways to becoming a social worker. Currently there are 26 active job ads in Lancaster County!
